1 **“All Signs Point to a New Horizon”**
Mark Chu & Charles Barbin

13-17 N New Jersey Avenue

Created during the first 48 Blocks AC Mural Week in 2018, Chu & Barbin’s mural evokes a cityscape of the past, while looking towards the future.

2 **“Spirit of Atlantic City”** C. Correa & L. Morgan

Little Water Distillery
807 Baltic Avenue

Correa & Morgan pay tribute to the storied history of Atlantic City, featuring Jazz legends, iconic locations, and even sea god King Neptune.

3 **“Gà”** Mark Chu

Com Ga Ninh Kieu
1124 Atlantic Avenue

Gà means chicken in Vietnamese. Chu aims to “normalize” diversity through the inclusion of the word “gà” in the mural.

4 **“Close Encounters”** Charles Barbin

7 S. South Carolina Avenue

Squint while viewing this mural (or break out some 3-D glasses) to experience the 3-D effect Barbin created. Barbin has created over 100 commissioned murals around the world!

5 **“Find Your Way”** Bernie McCabe

14 S. Tennessee Avenue

McCabe, of Mazing Art Studio, creates intricate text & image designs that incorporate fully solvable mazes. Can you find your way through the 4 paths of this mural?

6 **“A Little Bit of Everyone”** Denton Burrows

Best Liquors Store
1512 Pacific Avenue

Created during the first 48 Blocks AC Mural Week in 2018, Burrows’ mural represents a little bit of everyone he met in Atlantic City.

7 **“New York Avenue”** Jenna Morello

Side Pony Printshop
153 S. New York Avenue

Created for Foxx & Friends, a collaborative project with Create 48, Morello worked in her signature style—bold, bright blooms covering the entire wall.

8 **“The Eternal Happiness of Sonora's Horses”**
D.M. Weeks

Bywater Building
157 S. New York Avenue

A tribute to the famous Atlantic City diving horses and diver, Sonora Carver, blinded during a dive. Carver continued to dive blind for 11 years.

9 **“Jazzed”** Casey Bolding

Kelsey’s
1545 Atlantic Avenue

Bolding’s work has been described as “anxious and often subliminally suggestive”.

10 **“Culprit City”** 4sakh with The Culprits

Gem Liquors
1737 Atlantic Avenue

A homage to graffiti culture & street art, the letters “SAKN” are hidden in an array of expert aerosol line work & perfectly blended, dazzling colors.

11 “What Lifts You” Kelsey Montague

H&M, Tanger Outlets The Walk
128 N. Michigan Avenue

Montague is best known for her large scale, interactive street murals around the world. Jump into her mural and surf the wave! #WhatLiftsYou

12 “Pacific Garden” Shari Tobias

2518 Pacific Avenue

This Monopoly-themed mural presides over a community garden, adjacent to an art fence by Chung-Fan Chang. If you’re lucky, you might see the neighborhood cat wandering by!

13 “Universal Love” Edwin Rivera

China Inn
3301 S. Sovereign Avenue

Making a statement about love throughout the universe, Rivera overlaps images of man, woman, and child in an otherworldly composition.

14 “Mind Power” Luz Sanchez & Marcus Hughes

110–111 N. Sovereign Avenue

Mind Power is inspiration for the students in Atlantic City. Sanchez attended Sovereign Avenue School and shared it’s a “special and nostalgic place” and she’s honored to make a positive impact in her community.

15 “Before I Die” Genesis Sandoval

110–111 N. Sovereign Avenue

“Before I Die” is part of a global participatory art project originated by artist Candy Chang. Each wall is a tribute to living an examined life, inviting communities to come together & share their dreams.

16 “Bright Skies” Manuela Guillén

110–111 N. Sovereign Avenue

Guillén has painted murals around the globe. Her art integrates activism with happy, bright colors, plant images, symbols of festivity, & good wishes. “Bright Skies” mixes joyful imagery with inspiring messages.

The Atlantic City Arts Foundation has been the driving force behind mural art in Atlantic City since 2017. The public arts nonprofit has created 96 murals, in partnership with local and regional organizations, businesses, and community groups. 80 are still intact throughout the 48 blocks of the city.
